



## Continuing Legal Education (CLE) Credit Information for 2020

\*UPDATE (12/7/20): We have received approval for the Nevada CLE Credits.\*

AEMA has applied for **14** general Continuing Legal Education (CLE) credits in 60-minute states and **16.8** hours of CLE credit in 50-minute states for the following Technical Sessions:

- Monday, November 30 from 1-3 p.m.: “2020 Public Lands;”
- Tuesday, December 1 from 9-11 a.m.: “The New MSHA and the New Normal;”
- Wednesday, December 2
  - From 9-11 a.m.: “NEPA at 50+, What will be the New Normal?;”
  - From 1-3 p.m.: “Cultural Resources Best Practices: Planning, Implementing and Troubleshooting;”
- Thursday, December 3
  - From 9-11 a.m.: “Old Meets New: Solving Old School Problems with New Technology and Modern Tactics;”
  - From 1-3 p.m.: “Mine Closure and Reclamation;” and
- Friday, December 4 from 9-11 a.m.: “Opportunities & Challenges in an Election Year.”

To qualify for the CLE credits you must pay a separate, additional \$350 registration and comply with the certification requirements in your state. AEMA has also applied for **8** hours of CLE credit in 60-minute states and **9.6** hours of CLE credit in 50-minute states for the **U.S. Mining Law Short Course**, **14** hours of CLE credit in 60-minute states and **16.8** hours of CLE credit in 50-minute states for the **Understanding the SEC’s New Mining Disclosure Rule: S-K 1300 Short Course**.

AEMA has applied for CLE accreditation in Colorado, Minnesota, Nevada, and Utah. If you require credits in another state, please notify Pat Heywood ([pheywood@miningamerica.org](mailto:pheywood@miningamerica.org)) in order that AEMA can apply for accreditation. Note that the State Bar of Arizona does not approve or accredit CLE activities for the Mandatory Continuing Legal Education requirement.
